Shottesbrooke is a small exclusive family owned vineyard and winery set in the eastern pocket of the beautiful and tranquil McLaren Vale, just 45 minutes from Adelaide. Magnificent views over the gum-studded vineyards, up to the rolling Willunga Hills, can be viewed from the award winning cellar door.

Blanc de Blanc is a French term meaning “whitest of whites” and is commonly used to describe a sparkling wine made from 100% Chardonnay grapes, rather than the more traditional Chardonnay and Pinot blends.

The story behind 1337...

In the year 1337, one of the greatest knights of England Sir William de Trussell, commissioned the construction of the Shottesbrooke church. Historically famous for indulging in the finer things in life, Sir William built the church to quell the unease surrounding his lavish lifestyle. Centuries later, our founder’s grandfather served Shottesbrooke as the Parish Vicar, and this beautiful church is where our winery takes its name.

1337 is a toast to our history and heritage.

Tasting Notes

Colour Pale straw with a slight green tinge and a fine, persistent bead.

Nose Classic Blanc de Blanc nose that displays Granny Smith apples and lime notes with traces of almond, orange and peach.

Palate A sophisticated palate that shows a beautifully defined sparkling wine with intense, lingering flavours of lime, lemon and freshly baked bread.

Food Match Perfect served as an aperitif, with char-grilled Australian seafood or after a meal as a palate cleanser.

Cellaring Drink now until 2015.
