First planted by founder, Nick Holmes, over 30 years ago, Shottesbrooke is proudly an estate grown and managed boutique winery.

In the year 1337, one of the great knights of England, Sir William de Trussell, commissioned the construction of the Shottesbrooke church. Famous for his indulgent lifestyle, he sought to appease his critics with this generous contribution to the parish. Winemaking

Muscat made from Rutherglen is an Australian treasure. The skill of the blender is passed down from one generation to the next, resulting in wines of considerable intensity and flavour. This Muscat is classified as "Rare", meaning its average age is over 20 years with some components being much older (up to 40 years in this case).

Tasting Notes

Colour	Dark amber with a slight olive hue.
Nose	Concentrated and complex, featuring espresso, dark chocolate and Christmas spice.
Palate	Defined by caramel, raisin and dried figs, the full-bodied palate, helped by sweetness, has an extraordinary length.
Cellaring	Drink now or add another decade.
Food Match	Muscat is a versatile food partner, whether with savoury dishes or cheese and desserts.
